Bird Watching Group

Visit to Hythe Quay Maldon

Saturday 5th December started with a beautiful clear bright morning, the last of the tide was ebbing away as the group gathered the Hythe to start our epic journey to Byrhtnoth's statue.

The retreating water had left the usual expanse of mud where we hoped to find birds feeding. A flock of Black Headed Gulls were occupying a stretch of water close to the opposite bank and were obviously engaged in fishing for fry as they were continually diving into the shallows following the shoal as it moved up and down the river.

Again on the far bank was a large roosting flock of small plump bodied waders, it took some time to determine that these were Golden Plover with Lapwings around the edges of the flock. Standing nearby just on the waters edge was a tall white heron with black bill and legs and yellow feet stooping occasionally with its long bill darting into the water to bring out small fish this beautiful bird was a Little Egret (Egretta Garztta)

My 1974 Book of British Birds describes the Little Egret as an occasional summer visitor wintering south of the Mediterranean. In my most up to date book the Egret is described as resident and increasing in numbers. Maldon has quite a large population which according to one of the many locals who stopped to talk to us tend to roost in or on the mud flats opposite the Queens Head.

We made our way to the point and Byrhtnoth where we observed flights of Canada Geese keeping very low following the course of the now incoming tide only rising as they turned to skim the sea wall and presumably land on the gravel pit lakes . Returning to the Hythe we witnessed the flock of Golden Plover rise and perform an aerial ballet right in front of us before heading out towards Northey Island.

Members of the group have continued to be enthusiastic and very active since the summer, covering in recent meetings some background on Trees, identifying trees from their leaves, and something of their physiology. Some field work was undertaken during a visit to the former Stow Maries Halt, where a nature reserve has been established incorporating the disused railway line. As always with our outdoor visits, we had excellent weather. We have also studied and constructed Keys, and carried out a different way to preserve specimens for identification. Although they are not strictly speaking plants, we wanted to include Fungi in our brief, and were fortunate to have a guest speaker, Tony Boniface, who brought along many and varied samples to go with ones we found. The weather seems to have been suitable for them over the last week or so, and with his very expert and informed guidance, he encouraged us with the use of a key, to identify the specimens we had. Our next session will include Fruits and Seeds, and a review of our Fungi theory.

A card is posted through your door from a company called PDS (Parcel Delivery Service) suggesting that they were unable to deliver a parcel and that you need to contact them on 0906 6611911 (a Premium rate number).

DO NOT call this number, as this is a mail scam originating from Belize.

If you call the number and you start to hear a recorded message you will already have been billed £15 for the phone call.

If you do receive a card with these details, then please contact Royal Mail Fraud on 020 7239 6655.

What is it that persuades 64 people to descend on Langford Village Hall on a very wet November night? Yes – the yearly Beetle Drive!


