LAST MINUTE XMAS CAKE

- 1 Sample the whisky to check for quality

I had an email from my bank saying that they had stopped access to my account on line as they feared it had been hacked. To rectify this they advised me to click on the accompanying link.

I wasn't happy about this and so went into the local branch with a printed copy of the email. I was told that it was a fraud – there was a spelling mistake which is often a guide to such fraudsters. Also the bank's way of communicating when they suspect irregular action is not this way.

The important advice given is that **NEVER** connect using their printed link. Go to your account in your usual way with password etc and that is fine. This would apply to any other unsolicited advice concerning money.

Watch out – there are rogues about.

A card is posted through your door from a company called PDS (Parcel Delivery Service) suggesting that they were unable to deliver a parcel and that you need to contact them on 0906 6611911 (a Premium rate number).

If you call the number and you start to hear a recorded message you will already have been billed £315 for the phone call.

If you do receive a card with these details, then please contact Royal Mail Fraud on 020 7239 6655.
